LONDON, SATURDAY, NOV. 23. A Craven Argument.

Many Canadians who sympathize with the free trade cause in Great Britain and would regret the loss of the powerful aid which the British fiscal example gives to tariff reformers in every country, have no sympathy with some of the arguments used by Mr. Chamberlain's opponents. There is something craven in the fear expressed by Mr. Ritchie, Mr. Morley, Lord Rosebery and other free traders, that Mr. Chamberlain's policy will invite retaliation by the United States with disastrous results to the British Empire.

The first result of Mr. Chamberlain's policy would be to bring Britain into bitter fiscal warfare with our cousins in the United States, as the result of which Great Britain would lose everything that she gains nothing. It would mean a practical severance far more deplorable than a fiscal war.

If his plan is carried out by the most adventurous of British politicians, of colonial preference, a tariff war will be inaugurated between Great Britain and the United States, and this English politician will seek to set Canada up as a great rival to us, an agricultural rival.

It is the people of Great Britain and the colonies rightly or wrongly, believe that the British Empire will be strengthened by drawing all portions together in the bonds of commercial interest, are they to be deterred by threats of reprisals or fear of another country?

The United States tariff has apparently done its worst to Canada, and any damage it can inflict on Great Britain is trifling compared with the loss which Great Britain, the market of the world, can inflict on the United States. Canadians have no fear of the consequences of a tariff war with the United States.

The Free Press is trying hard to crawl out of the trap into which it was lured by the bait of a forged letter, written by some enemy of the Ross Government.

The British punitive expedition, which has gone into Tibet, to enforce treaty obligations, is more interesting than most forays on the borders of the Empire. No country is so little known to the world as Tibet.

The Attorney-General is showing backbone in championing the new bill which will limit the number of people who escape the personality tax altogether.

While the Free Press published the spurious letter in good faith, it is blameworthy for the use to which it put the forgery. It made no effort to verify the writer's assertions.

For what can be gathered of the facts, Mr. Moore and his fellow-commissioners were warranted in their holding the license from Mr. Branton himself, who had offered public morality by being concerned in the "plugging" of ballots.

In other words the license commissioners of St. Thomas, whom the Free Press was so ready to attack on the ground of partisanship and favoritism, are now admitted to have done their duty in denying a license to a Liberal worker who had been convicted of election irregularities.

Proceeding there was a rumour over the proposed transfer of Branton's license to another person, who offered to lease or buy the premises. The Free Press took a hand in the controversy, and was then anything but favorable to Branton. Now can it claim it was deceived by the forged letter into re-

garding Branton as an injured innocent? In the attempt to make political capital it has overreached itself and fallen into a pit of its own digging.

The merchants should pay more for, they were getting rich, building fine houses, living in luxury and paying very little taxes.

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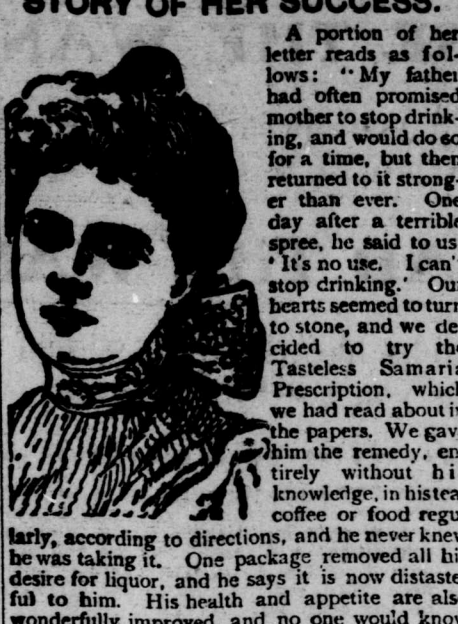
