

OILING OF STREETS CREATES PROBLEM

St. Thomas Council Discussed Non-Payment of Costs by Institutions.

Special to The Advertiser St. Thomas, Sept. 2.—The finance committee of the city council this evening discussed thoroughly the advisability of sprinkling and oiling the roads in front of certain publid institutions which are not compelled by law to bear the expense of the

local improvement tax.

The aldermen came to the con-clusion that the properties in question should be advised of the expense they were causing the municipality and be asked to contribute to th upkeep of the streets on which they fronted. City Treasurer Perry, who opened the discussion, advised that if this appeal should fail, that an cumulated deficit be taken care of i yearly installments from the general tax. Mr. Perry cited five instances totalling an accumulated deficit of \$13,748—the courthouse, fronting ou four streets, the St. Thomas Cemetery on Chester street, two Y.M.C.A. buildings on Talbot street, the Children's Shelter on Wellington street, and the Armories during a three-year period when it was used as a public school. The aldermen supported Mr. Perry in his con-

Mr. Perry stated that the poll taxes were coming in very slowly, only \$300 out of the customary \$700 being collected so far.
