Rich Silver Ledge Said to Have Been Located Within Victoria's Limits.

Rosland Miners' Union Sends Down a Representative--Albani Ores.

Charles Parker, who for several weeks recently was a guest at the Brunswick, has given the gentlemen who met there, as well as others who became acquainted with him during his visit, a tantalizing puzzle to worry their brains over, in the shape of a fine simple of silver galena as the most devoted lover of the white metal would care to feast his eyes upon. The specimen which Mr. Parker carried along with him while here was so rich that the solid silver could be cut out of it with a knife—and the vondrous part of it was that he solemnly declared he had found the specimen in the James Bay section of Victoria city. Just where the vein was located he declined to disclose; he had, he said, taken steps toward forming a company, and would not even stake or reveal his claim until he was ready to develop the property, as he did not want everyone crowding upon him at the outset. His chief fear, he declared, was that the ore ran down to a wedge, and would soon work out. Mr. Parker has now returned to Cariboo, where he is widely known as an experienced and reliable miner, given to romancing or to practical jokes. He promises to be back in Victoria in about one month's time, and in the meanwhile, all who have seen his specimens are industriously prospecting every likely corner of the South ward—but as yet with absolutely no success.

Property Changing Hands and Development Work Being Done.

With the opening of spring and the disappearance of the snow mining property in Alberni is now changing hands and development work is proceeding apace. 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Kerr's Life Sacrificed.

Such the Decision of Coroner's Jury on This Painful Case.

Medical Health Officer Replies to Charges Against Isolation Hospital.

"James Kerr, aged about 35, a printer in the Colonist building and lately residing at the Brunswick hotel, Victoria, came to his death on April 18th by drowning in the Straits, he being at the time in a state of delirium, caused by his sickness, erysipelas.

"The jury are of the opinion that the man's life was sacrificed through the want of an institution in the city where such cases can be properly taken care of, and we strongly recommend that the present system of admitting such cases to the isolation hospital be very considerably modified in order that patients can be taken charge of immediately on application.

"We suggest that the isolation hospital be placed under the control of the directors of the Royal Jubilee hospital, and under its present management the institution is practically useless.

Such was the verdict given by the coroner's jury yesterday met to enquire into the death of James Kerr, who wandered from the Dawson hotel on Monday night delirious and whose body was found on the beach at Beacon hill the following morning. The evidence given confirmed what was published yesterday morning in respect to the case.

Thomas Sweetland, proprietor of the Brunswick hotel, testified that Frank Hall had ordered the deceased last week to remain in his room for ten days. This was on Wednesday. He saw Kerr on Sunday and said that he was delirious. He said he was leaving the hotel because he had not received proper attention.

Dr. Hall said when he saw the deceased he was suffering from a mild attack of facial erysipelas. He asked Dr. Hart to send him to the isolation hospital on Sunday and said that he had a surgical case on. All such cases should be sent to the isolation hospital as it was dangerous for such patients to be around, but under the present system there was a great deal of trouble in securing admittance, unless the attending physician was willing to take the cost of the patient and the cost of the nurse.
