For Reorganization of Chinese Empire Made to Minister Conger.

French Designs on Yunnan Cause Trouble in That Province.

The following interesting resolutions adopted by the Americans at Peking and presented to the American minister, Mr. Conger, at his suggestion...

"1. That those who are found to have been leaders in this anti-foreign movement be adequately punished.

"2. That the native Christian be indemnified for the losses of life and property which they have suffered in this persecution.

"3. That all temples, shrines, and idolatrous rites, as a condition of holding civil and military office, be abolished.

"4. That all Chinese, irrespective of religious belief, shall be placed upon the same footing in all proceedings in the courts.

"5. That all travelling expenses, including those to and from the frontier, be paid by the government...

"6. That the Chinese government, adequate allowance should be made for the expenses of the missionaries to leave China.
