It is organized under the auspices of the Provincial Boys' Work Board of the Maritime Religious Education Council. All boys in their fifteenth year or over who are anxious to make their lives count, and who want to enjoy a get-together of real live fellows for fellowship, fun, instruction and inspiration, are eligible for registration and membership. It is open to all boys, ministers, S. S. superintendents, teachers of boys' classes, and others who are interested in the boys of the community. Leaders of Trux Square or older Trail all-boys Camps should plan to attend in a body. Registration should be in the hands of the Registrar of the Conference, Mr. Herman S. Murray, Chatham, N. B., three days before the conference, if possible.

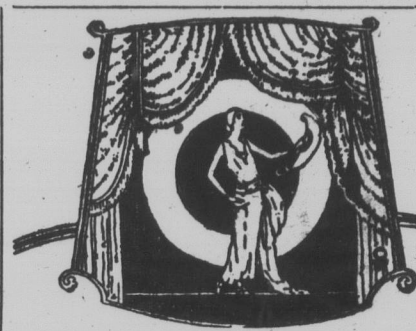

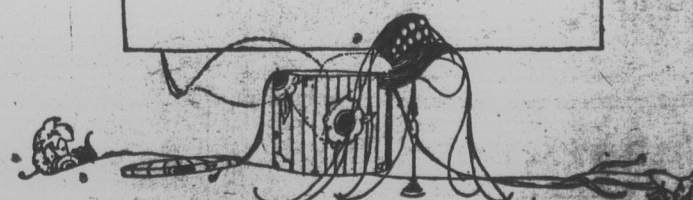
