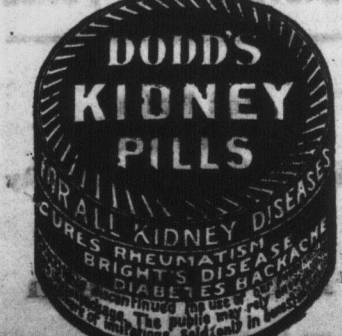

Havana, Aug. 24.—A force of government artillery under command of Captain Pujillo today captured San Juan De Martines without resistance.

At San Antonio De Los Baños, Havana province, 21 miles southwest of Havana, a detachment of rural guards today encountered a band of insurgents.

While the troops were being conveyed by railroad train from Pinar Del Rio to San Juan De Martines, ordinary traffic on the railroad was suspended.

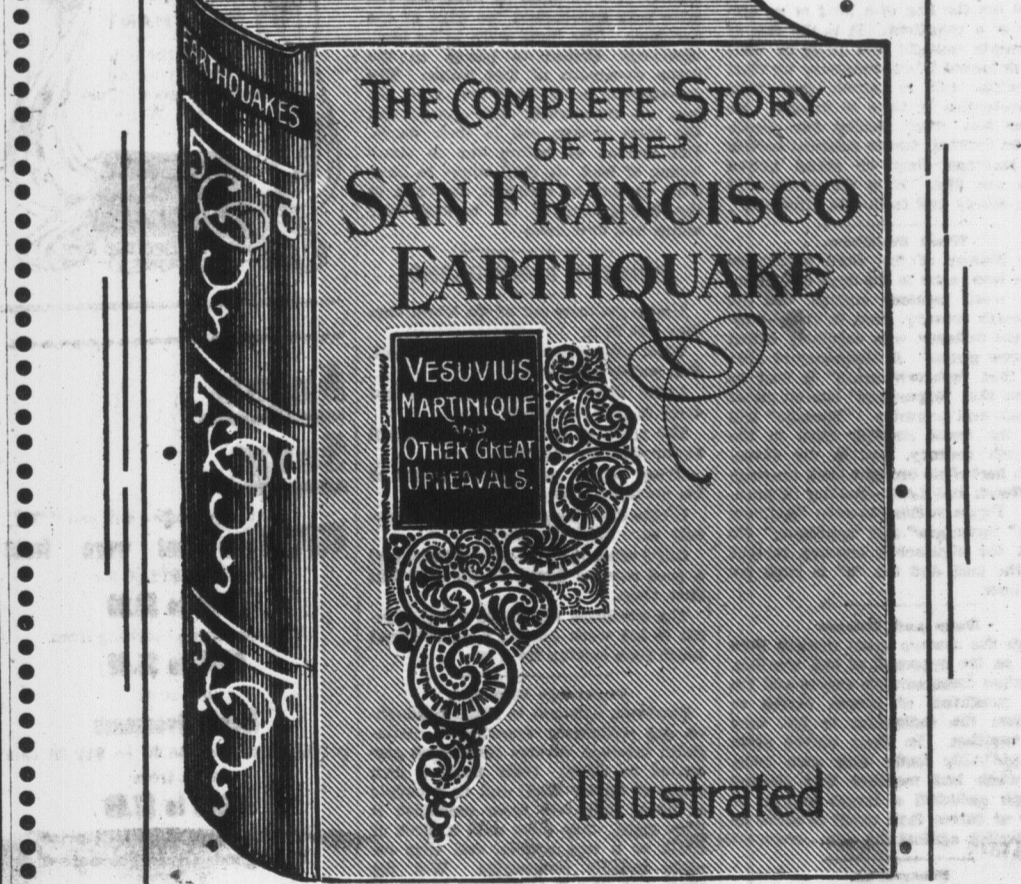
