MR. MENZIES WAS BORN IN CHANGTE-HO, HONAN, CHINA, ON MOVEMBER 29, 1916. HE STUDIED AT THE UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO WHERE HE RECEIVED A B.A. DEGREE AND AT HARVARD UNIVERSITY WHERE HE RECEIVED A M.A. DEGREE. HE JOINED THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS IN 1940. HE SERVED IN HAVANA AS SECOND SECRETARY IN 1945-1946. HE WAS APPOINTED HEAD OF THE CANADIAN LIAISON MISSION IN TOKYO IN NOVEMBER 1950 AND, FOLLOWING THE CONCLUSION OF THE PEACE TREATY WITH JAPAN, BECAME CHARGE D'AFFAIRES A.I. AT THE CANADIAN EMBASSY IN TOKYO IN APRIL 1952. UPON HIS RETURN TO OTTAWA, IN JUNE 1953, HE WAS APPOINTED HEAD OF THE FAR EASTERN DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS, A POST WHICH HE HELD UNTIL HE WAS APPOINTED HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR CANADA IN THE FEDERATION OF MALAYA IN MARCH-1957. HE ATTENDED THE COLOMBO PLAN CONFERENCE IN WELLINGTON, NEW ZEALAND, IN 1956, AND IN SAIGON, VIETNAM, IN 1957.
