6. Does the Department own a Lockheed "Jet Star" and, if so (a) when was it purchased (b) at what cost (c) for what purpose (d) what sum or sums have been expended to modify it (e) when (f) how many hours has it flown (g) what has been the purpose of these flights (h) how many passengers does it carry (i) what is the cost to the Department for one hour's flying time of this aircraft (j) has it ever been used for high-level calibration?
