

PRIZES and HONOURS.

1. The Science Undergraduate Society's prizes for summer essays are awarded each year by a special committee of the Faculty. Each Department is expected to submit the best essays written by its students for consideration by this committee.

2. Other prizes are awarded by the Faculty, upon the recommendation of its Committee, after consultation with the heads of the Departments concerned.

3. Students who have been exempted in certain subjects shall be eligible for exhibitions and prizes which are given for standing in the complete curriculum of the year, their standing being calculated on the basis set forth (see "Standing," etc.) In the case, however, of prizes or exhibitions given for individual subjects, or groups of subjects, in one or more of which the student has been exempted, he must take the regular examination or examinations in all subjects, to be eligible for these prizes. 4. Honours are awarded to students making an average of at least 80% in the principal subjects of their courses in the fourth year. (May 22, 1923.)
