Then the R. W. Senior Grand Warden shall say:

R. W. Junior Grand Warden: It is the will and pleasure of the Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Prince Edward Island, that the officers and members of the Grand Lodge and Brethren here assembled do now assist him in laying the Foundation Stone of the New City Building. This you will communicate to the Brethren, that they having due notice may govern themselves accordingly.

Then the R. W. Junior Grand Warden shall say:

Brethren: You have heard the order of the M. W. Grand Master of Masons, as communicated to me through the R. W. Senior Grand Warden. Of this you will take due notice and let it be accordingly so done.

Then shall be sung the Ancient Masonic Hymn as follows:

When the earth's foundation first was laid,
By the Almighty Artist's hand,
'Twas then our perfect, our perfect laws were made
Established by His strict command.
Hail! mysterious, hail, glorious Masonry!
That makes us ever great and free.

As man throughout for shelter sought,
