Had the Honour to receive your Letter dated from Dublin the 23d ult. the Contents whereof I communicated immediately to Sir Bibye Lake, who allows me the Liberty to inform you, that the Company did, by the Ships which failed hence laft Year, transinit your Directions to their Agent at Churchill, for preparing a Sloop, and fuch other Matters as should be neceffary to protecute the Difcovery you mention; about which they defign to give their farther Inftructions next Seafon.

I was not at *Churct ill* myfelf lait Summer, as you feem to think, but at *Albany*; and I could not there receive any new Information about the Probability of a Paffage. *I am, Sir*,
