Captain Middleton's first Letter to me.

SIR, *London, January 16, 1735.*

I Had the Honour to receive your Letter dated from *Dublin* the 23^d *ult.* the Contents whereof I communicated immediately to *Sir Bibye Lake*, who allows me the Liberty to inform you, that the Company did, by the Ships which failed hence last Year, transmit your Directions to their Agent at *Churchill*, for preparing a Sloop, and such other Matters as should be necessary to prosecute the Discovery you mention; about which they design to give their farther Instructions next Season.

I was not at *Churchill* myself last Summer, as you seem to think, but at *Albany*; and I could not there receive any new Information about the Probability of a Passage. I am, Sir,
