certainly none of the Technocrats in our area did it, I will not make any definite statement on the others. But I will say this, that the Tochnocrats were interested in any power production equipment and so on; it was featured in pictures in all our magazines to emphasize the power age; that is the only reason any Technocrat might be taking pictures of power plants and so on. They appeared in all our magazines to emphasize that one point.

- Q. This is not pictures, it is diagrams and sketches.

 A. Off hand I would say, no. I cannot vouch for the rest
 of the Canadian Technocrats though. I certainly have no
 knowledge of anything of that nature.
- Q. That is what I wanted to know, you have no knowledge of that? A. Right.

- Q. Before going on to another point; referring to those articles read by Mr. Anderson? A. Yes.
- Q. You recognize those as literature issued by Technocracy?
 A. Right.
- Q. Where had you seen them before? You appeared to recognize them as being literature issued by Technocracy Inc.?

 A. Because they had been sent to our section in Toronto as file copies.
 - Q. As file copies? A. Yes.
- Q. They had been sent to headquarters of your section in Toronto? A. Yes.
 - Q. You saw them there? A. Yes.
- Q. I suppose they would be sent to all the organizations in Canada?

 A. Right, file copies of any new publications that were sent out went to each section.
