Citizen Potel has discovered, that oxygenated muriatic acid gas may be employed with the greatest advantage in all cases of afphysia. Several rats which had been found drowned, being placed whithin the action of some of this gas, were speedily resuscitated: he repeated the experiment on the same rats, and on several cats, with equal success; he even made some experiments on himself, which were crowned with success. The Academy of Dijon has appointed commissioners to ascertain the property of this gas in cases of apparent sudden death.

The number of combinations in a newly-invented lock by M. J. Berard, is equal to the eightieth power of 2, or nearly 17 millions.

A new gas, composed of hydrogen, carbon, and phosphorus, has been discovered by M. TROMMSDORUE: it is nearly of the same specific gravity as common air: infoluble in water; undergoes no change when mixed with oxigen; it does not act upon the solutions of metallic oxides, which are not reducible by heat; but decomposes the shuld saline compounds, countaining gold, silver, or mercury.
