

Citizen POREL has discovered, that oxygenated muriatic acid gas may be employed with the greatest advantage in all cases of *asphyxia*. Several rats which had been found drowned, being placed within the action of some of this gas, were speedily resuscitated: he repeated the experiment on the same rats; and on several cats, with equal success; he even made some experiments on himself, which were crowned with success. The Academy of Dijon has appointed commissioners to ascertain the property of this gas in cases of apparent sudden death.

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
