Closest Race of Canoe Regatta in Senior Fours—Paddling in Choppy Water.

The annual regatta of the Canadian Canoe Association was held Saturday over the Toronto Canoe Club's half-mile straight-away course at the foot of York street.

Everyone was on their toes when the gun was fired for the half-mile canoe race. There were seven entries.

Within 100 yards of the finish, when New Edinburgh put on a marvelous spurt and practically shot out of the water, catching B.B., who were two boat lengths ahead of them and finished two feet to the good. Carlton Place came in third, about one length behind B.B.

They fought a great fight for the trophy, but could not get enough steam up at the finish, and the heavy Edinburgh beat them to it.

BULSE WINS MEMORIAL
STAKES AT SARATOGA

George Smith an Also Ran Trial by Jury Takes the Travers Stakes.

SARATOGA, Aug. 7.—Out of the west came Bulse, the big, sturdy, chestnut by Disguise-Netherland, to battle for the Sanford Memorial Stakes, valued at \$3500, for two-year-olds. Bulse, racing in the colors of J. W. Parrish, carried 127 lbs. and won decisively by length after making all the running. J. M. Camden's horse Henry was second, three lengths in front of J. S. Keene's Jacoba.

Irrespective of carrying top weight and conceding from five to seventeen pounds to each one of his opponents, Bulse's victory was all the more impressive because he beat George Smith, the hitherto invincible Maryland and Canadian champion.

George Smith had a long string of victories, without a blemish in the shape of defeat, until his start today. He raced well, but was unable to finish better than fifth. Nine colts and fillies followed him.
