“ What these regulations will be, can-
 “ not yet be known with certainty. But,
 “ from the measures which the wisdom
 “ of Parliament has already adopted with
 “ respect to some parts of North-Ame-
 “ rica, we may conjecture that they will
 “ not be very different from these that
 “ follow.

“ In the first place the democratical
 “ charters of Connecticut and Rhode-
 “ Island (which vest in the people of
 “ those provinces the right of annually
 “ chusing their own governours, councils,
 “ and assemblies without any interference
 “ of the crown,) will be either totally
 “ abolished, as absurd and incompatible
 “ with the genius of the British govern-
 “ ment,
