"What these regulations will be, can"not yet be known with certainty. But,
"from the measures which the wisdom
of Parliament has already adopted with
"respect to some parts of North-Ame"rica, we may conjecture that they will
"not be very different from these that
"follow.

"In the first place the democratical charters of Connecticut and RhodeIsland (which vest in the people of those provinces the right of annually chusing their own governours, councils, and assemblies without any interference of the crown,) will be either totally abolished, as absurd and incompatible with the genius of the British govern—
"ment,
