## AN ADDRESS and CAUTION to the PUBLIC.

THE unwarrantable attempts that have been made in various publications, *anonymous, (or not avowed by the person, whose name one thereof bore, when called upon)* to prepossess the minds of the public with regard to His Majesty's Canadian Subjects, by statements and assertions equally partial, false, and scandalous, oblige us, on behalf of our countrymen, thus publickly to disavow and contradict them—and indeed, in our opinion, such contemptible and palpable efforts to mislead require *only* to be contradicted.

THE sentiments of the Canadians are stated in Addresses and Petitions to His Majesty, which an opposition to a system of government, proposed by a part of the ancient subjects, and approved by some of the new, rendered necessary to shew, that such a system was by no means agreeable to the Canadians in general.

THESE Addresses and Petitions are in the hands of His Majesty's Ministers, and with their permission alone we will direct them to be published.

THE
