CHAS. E. Moss was born about 1860 and died, at Ottawa, in 1901. He was 'made an Associate of the Royal Canadian Academy in 1897, and was elected Academician in the following year. Although a painter of portraits and figures, often of a decorative and classical character, he devoted himself largely to the painting of the landscape of Quebec, particularly of the neighbourhood of Murray Bay where he had a summer house. He is represented in the National Gallery, Ottawa.
