Lower Prices at Chicago on General Round of Bearish Stalistics-Trading Narrow and Professional.

CHICAGO, Oct. 6.—Prospect of a uge increase in the visible supply old made wheat sag to-day as trading.

Aitho wheat during most of the day had ranged above last night's levol, owners became dubious regarding 5.-000,000 bushels difference between receipts and shipments at primary markets for the last five days. In this connection, it was pointed out that northwestern stocks exhibited a gain of nearly 4.000.000 bushels this week as against less than half that amount a year ago. Estimates were out, too, for a record-breaking crop in the Argentine, and there were complaints from Canada that shipments to Europe so far this season had been the smallest ever known. Nevertheless, except in the last half hour the market leaned to the buil side, being influenced by frost reports from Argentina, the outlook for small world shipments, assertions of crop damage in the northwest, and by statements that delay to seeding of winter wheat may seriously cut acreage down. Between the opening and the close, December fluctuated from 98 to 98 5-8c, with the finish weak at 98 to 98 1-8c, a loss of 1-9c net.
