### THAMINGTON WORKS BEGINS TO TEST SMOKE CONSUMER

If Satisfactory Manufacturers Must Buy—County Council Deadlock.

Hamilton, Jan. 23—(Special)—The board of works this evening agreed to raise the pay of the foremost of the seven wards from \$2.50 to \$3 a day and agreed to test a smoke consumer in the city hall. If satisfactory the manufacturers must invest in them. Chairman Stewart and the city solicitor will get an appointment with the C.R. with reference to its north end plans. The railway commission may be appealed to. The board will have a special meeting to look over evidence in connection with the arbitration for a reduction in the street lighting rate. A gas lamp has been installed at King William and Emerald streets, and is taking of substituting gas at a cost of about \$30 a year for such gas lamp. The city is paying about \$84 a light to the C.R. Power Company. The cost of building streets and walks in the annex will be estimated and the manufacturers asked to pay part of cost.

The Toronto and Niagara Power Company this afternoon applied to the select Township Council for permission to erect steel poles along the beach on the public highway. The beach residents entered a protest and the council postponed action. The county council is made up of six Conservatives and one Liberal. One was nominated and voted upon today, but the deadlock could not be broken. Councillor Miller was considered the chief Conservative candidate, and Councillor Martin the leading Liberal. Miller broke on the second division to-day, Councillor Stewart of Beverley Township, a Liberal, was elected by a majority of 10.
