WINNIPEG MAN IS FIRST OF CANADA'S WINNERS

Sergeant Blackburn Gets Away With \$1000 From the Bisley Meet

(Canadian Associated Press Cable.) BISLEY CAMP, July 26.—Sergeant A. M. Blackburn of Winnipeg, the "unattached" man with the Canadian Bisley team, is easily the leading prize-winner among the Canadians.

To begin with he has the Prince of Wales' prize, \$500 in cash, as well as the Prince of Wales' badge, and N.R.A. badge. With his Birmingham Munition Cup he gets another \$125, and he divides the first prize of \$175 in the Martin Match with another competitor. In the King's prize, Blackburn got fifteen points, value \$150. His second place in the Service Rifle Championship brought him nothing but glory, and a silver jewel. But Blackburn was an "often mentioned" name in the list of minor prizes in other matches. It is quite possible that his winnings will total one thousand dollars easily.

Next to Blackburn, Lieut. Morris of the 46th Regiment, Bowmanville, is probably next in cash winnings. He takes \$200 with his third place in the King's prize. His Standard of Emulation prize includes \$105 in cash and his London Small Arms Rifle takes with it \$25. Morris also figured well in the lists of winners in nearly every match in which the Canadians contested.

Sergeant Bayliss of the Royal Grenadiers, Toronto, got \$25 with his Wimbledon Cup, and has figured up fairly well in other matches. Staff-Sergeant Richardson, Vancouver, thirteenth; Lieut. Morris, Bowmanville, fourteenth; Sergeant Smith, Ottawa, seventeenth; Sergeant-Major Huggins, Hamilton, twenty-sixth; Lieut. Freeborn, Hamilton, thirty-sixth; Lieut. Smith, Chatham, thirty-eighth.

Blackburn's prize in this match is the silver jewel. The other Canadians above get a bronze jewel.

The prizes are awarded to competitor with best scores in the grand aggregate (short ranges), Elkington (long ranges aggregate), and Martins (long range aggregate).

In the Martin Challenge Cup Competition Canadians were placed as follows: Morris, Bowmanville, tenth; \$25; Mitchell, Hamilton, 22nd; \$10; Black, Truro, 41st; Richardson, Victoria, 78th; Mortimer, Ottawa, 96th; Huggins, Hamilton, 107th; Jones, P.E.I., 102nd; all make \$10.
