## ENDOWMENT SUB-COMMITTEE.

May 3, 1864.—The sum of \$541.48, being the amount of Reserved Fourths, was returned to Yarmouth to be invested there for support of the incumbent.

March, 1865.—The sum of \$69.73 amount of Reserved Fourths and \$24 held in trust was returned to Truro for investment there.

April 22, 1865.—The amount of Reserved Fourths, \$123.36, was returned to Hubbard's Cove to be invested in a Parsonage House. The Committee hold securities for this fund to the amount of \$13,244.
