CONSUMPTION IS
BEING BEATEN BY
CARE IN BOSTON

In Ten Years Percentage of
Deaths Has Been Reduced from
25.08 to 16.89

Boston, Jan. 30.—That the death rate from tuberculosis has had a remarkable decrease throughout the world, and particularly in Boston, in the last 50 years was brought out at the annual meeting of the Massachusetts Association of Boards of Health here.

Dr. David D. Brough of the Boston board of health submitted a chart showing that the death rate from tuberculosis in Boston has decreased in ten years from 25.08 per cent. of the cases reported to 16.89 per cent. He read a paper on "The Importance of Registration and Control of Laryngeal and Pulmonary Tuberculosis."

The chief cause for the decrease was the improved methods of city sanitation and the strenuous efforts made to prevent overcrowding of population and diseases which always result. In order that the work might be continued more effectively, however, Dr. Brough recommended compulsory notification of cases by the physicians and the family concerned.

He pointed out that as early as 1772 the city government of Boston passed an ordinance compelling physicians to report all cases of consumption on pain of a heavy fine for first violation and ten years exile for second offense.

Dr. Mark W. Richardson read a paper recommending greater attention to the care of the eyes of infants and suggesting state regulation of midwifery.
