

In addition, the congregation has contributed by Sabbath collections, or by private subscriptions, for various other benevolent objects, the most important of which are the erection of the new College buildings, and, at no great distance from their site, the erection of a church for the Presbyterian people in the neighborhood. The amount of \$674.85, expended by the managers, from the ordinary revenue of the congregation, on the Mission premises on Sherbourne St., and on work carried on there would properly fall to be classified with the amounts mentioned here.
