CITY OF STANISLAU
GATE TO LEMBERGRailways Radiate in Five Di-
rections from the Town

BUCHAREST-BERLIN LINE

Place Was Completely Destroyed
by Fire in 1868 But Had 33,
000 People Before the War

Stanislaw, like Brody, is one of the
gateways through which the Russian
armies in Galicia expect to march rap-
idly toward Lemberg. This railway
centre is described in the National Geo-
graphic Society's war geography bulletin
as follows:

"Railways radiate from Stanislaw in
five directions, making it one of the
most important strategic cities of south-
eastern Galicia. This fact has made it
an important trading centre and manufac-
turing town, one of the most important
industries before the war being the con-
struction of rolling stock for the rail-
roads."

"The great trunk-line, passing through
Stanislaw is that which runs from Berlin
to Bucharest. Before the war it was
possible to leave Berlin at 7.30 one even-
ing, and, passing through Breslau, Ore-
schow, Posen, Lemberg, Stanislaw and
Cernowitza, reach the Rumanian capital
the following evening at 10.45. On this
line Stanislaw is eighty-seven miles south-
east of Lemberg and seventy-eight miles
northwest of Cernowitza and Cernowitza,
thirty-five miles from the former.

"An extremely important line to the
Russians is the road from the Russo-
Galician trading centre of Husiatyn, due
direction, via Dniestr to Strzyz, a fortified
town of 25,000 inhabitants situated on
the Strzyz river forty-two miles south
of Lemberg.

"The fifth spoke in the Stanislaw rail-
road wheel is a line to the south, passing
through Delatyn, thirty-six miles dis-
tant. This road, heading westward, af-
fords direct communication in a peace
time between Stanislaw and the Hun-
garian capital, Budapest, the distance
being about 875 miles.

"Stanislaw nestles between the two
forks of the Bystrica river, one of the
important southern tributaries of the Dnie-
ster, which flows ten miles to the north.
"The land in the vicinity of Stanislaw
is extremely fertile and before the war
the town, which had a population of
188,000 was an agricultural centre. Among
its industries in addition to its railroad
shops were reaping, milling and tile-mak-
ing.

"The most impressive bit of architec-
ture in the city is the handsome parish
church, which contains the tomb of the
famous Potocki family, one of whom
founded the place in the last half of the
17th century and another, Stanislaw Pot-
ocki, was largely instrumental in the
utter ruin of Poland. The latter was a
prominent youth became the standard-
bearer of the Crown at the age of 22. He
was intent upon dividing his country into
to an oligarchy of independent grandees
who were to enjoy supreme power in
rotation. With the aid of the Russian
empress, Catherine, he became a dictator
for a short time, but when the Prussian
