City of London To Honor Overseas Premiers At Conference

Meighen's Resignation to be Handed to Governor-General

CHANGE QUICKLY

Private Secretaries of Former Ministers Already at Capital to Take Over Offices.

OTTAWA, Sept. 24-Premier Meighen, it is now expected, will place his resignation in the hands of the Governor General either late this afternoon or tonight. Mr. Meighen again met members of his cabinet this morning, the meeting lasting till nearly one o'clock. The Prime Minister afterwards intimated that he had no announcement to make at present, but expected to have one late this afternoon or to-

night. Mr. Mackenzie King is understood to have his cabinet slate completed.

OTTAWA, Sept. 24—Members of the Liberal ministry about to take office, have been advised to "stand by" this morning. It is expected on Parliament Hill that Mr. Mackenzie Cings cabinet will be sworn in oday. The ministers of Mr. Meighen's retiring government were summoned to meet—pre-sumably for the last time—at 11 o'clock this morning. The resignation of the present government will be given to His Excellency the Governor General and Mr. King will be called al-

most immediately. The Liberal leader will be sworn in first by E. J. Lemaire, clerk of the Privy Council, in the presence of the Governor-General. Mr. King's ministers will likely take the oath of office at the same time, although it is not necessary for them to take office at once. It is possible that one or two might be absent in which case they could be sworn in later.
