


COOKERY COLUMN

1 teaspoon vanilla


1. Heat milk. 2. Mix cornstarch, sugar, sait and cocoa. **3.** Add gradually to hot milk. **4.** Cook over hot water 45 minutes.
5. Beat egg yolks slightly, add and cook a few min-utes longer.
6. Fill baked crust cover with meringue made of beaten whites and two table-spoons icing sugar.
7. Brown in oven.


