"SQUARE DEAL FOR THE KID"

Interesting Subjects Discussed at Yesterday's Sessions of The Women's Institute

Following the luncheon to which Mrs. W. B. Foster yesterday entertained the delegates to the Women's Institute at the Mayor House, the members returned to the city and attended a public session in the Imperial Theatre. Hon. Dr. Roberts presided and there was a free discussion concerning the work of child welfare.

In his introductory remarks Hon. Dr. Roberts said it was a particular pleasure to him to preside at such a meeting because the Women's Institute stood for home development, their organization knowing no class or creed and striving for noble principles, because of his high respect for the personal and the organization and because of the subject which was to be discussed. He referred to the good accomplished by the Victorian Order of which Mrs. Hanington is the chief organizer in Canada. Going on to show that, as the nineteenth century had developed commerce so the twentieth, having suffered tremendous losses of human lives in the great war and the ravages of the worst epidemic the world had known, in order to recon its resources of citizens must develop humanitarian work with child welfare as its foundation. Public health must be extended to this end.

He pointed out that the Women's Institute, having home and country for their interests, must have child welfare as one of their chief aims, as it was the foundation of the homes. He hoped the present gathering would be a means of launching a public programme for child welfare and that all present having heard of the work and how it could be carried out would do their utmost in arousing public interest in such a way that financial and personal support would be forthcoming for public health and child welfare work distributed throughout the length and breadth of the province.

Before Dr. Roberts called upon Dr. Hanington to give an account of her work as medical inspector in the schools of St. John Miss Louise Anderson sang most pleasingly.

Dr. Hanington strongly urged the women to see that children did not stay up late at night or drink tea at an early age. Both she maintained to be detrimental in the extreme to the children's health. She spoke of the value of having the mother present when the child was medically examined in the schools and told of many of the amusing things which a medical inspector meets with.

In her concluding words, she spoke most seriously of the need for discrimination in favor of backward children and the providing of special care for the mentally deficient in early life in order to protect society, to reduce the number of delinquents and criminals and to save
