The witness is questioned by the Court:

- Q.345 You said that after the parade on Monday, Lieutenant Watson -
A.345 who was the troop commander of De Bartok?
 Mister MacKay.
- Q.346 Lieutenant MacKay came up to you and asked about going to
A.346 Gronigen. This was prior to De Bartok speaking to you?
 Yes.
- Q.347 And then you told Lieutenant MacKay that he could go?
A.347 Yes sir.
- Q.348 And then you said that you told Tengum - or rather you told
A.348 De Bartok to see Tengum and that the vehicle was fixed.
 Yes sir.
- Q.349 Did you tell Lieutenant Wagner or anybody to sign a Work
A.349 Ticket, or was it quite OK for Lieutenant Wagner to sign it.
 I don't remember telling any of the officers.
- Q.350 What happens to Work Tickets after they are finished?
A.350 They are turned in to the transport Corporal.
- Q.351 Are they kept?
A.351 They are supposed to be kept but on occasions they're not
 kept. That is on checking we found that Corporal Larson
 had been slightly inefficient in his job and had not kept
 all the Work Tickets.
- Q.352 This particular Work Ticket in question, was it missing?
A.352 I beg your pardon sir?
- Q.353 The question is, this Work Ticket, the one which enabled the
A.353 jeep to leave on Wednesday afternoon, is it missing?
 I couldn't say sir, I don't know.
- Q.354 You have made no investigations?
A.354 I've made no investigations myself, sir.

The witness is questioned by the Judge Advocate:

- Q.355 On the Monday where did you see Corporal De Bartok?
A.355 On the parade square, right after the morning parade had been
 broken off.
- Q.356 What time was it?
A.356 Approximately nine o'clock.
- Q.357 Did you speak to Corporal Tengum that day?
A.357 No sir.
- Q.358 And the first time you saw Tengum and De Bartok after that
A.358 morning parade, after that particular Monday, the first time
 you saw them again, during the week, was when?
 On Thursday morning when they both came up to my room.
- Q.359 Who was the MO that was looking after you?
A.359 Doctor Fassina.
- Q.360 About what time did they come back on Thursday morning?
A.360 They came up in my room approximately nine o'clock in the
 morning.
- Q.361 Who was in the room?
A.361 Lieutenant Coates.
- Q.362 Who else?
A.362 That's all - Mister Coates and myself.
