## M. G. TEED GRES TO RIVER COMMISSION

He Succeeds A. P. Barnhill as a Member of this Important International Tri-

It became known yesterday that on the 28th of November last, upon receipt of information that the government had cancelled the appointment of Sir George Gibbon, A. P. Barnill, K. C., and Miem Geoffrion, K. C. as members of the International Joint Commission under the Waterways Treaty, Mr. Barnhill, with the approval of representative liberals and friends of both political parties, wired his resignation as a member of the St. John River Commission, of which he has acted as chairman. M. G. Taed, K. C., has been appointed to succeed Mr. Barnhill.
