## TRADING IN THE WAR ISSUES OVER- SHADOWS DEALINGS IN OTHER STOCKS

More feverish manipulation at higher prices — Utter demoralization in markets for foreign exchange — Recovery in Copper Shares.

New York, Aug. 16.—Further furrows were under persistent pressure on manipulation of the war shares until the final hour, when a recovery in the exchange markets caused an inquiry for the Pacific and other dividend-payers.

Total sales aggregated 970,000 shares.

The feature of greatest unsettlement was the decline in remittances to London, Paris and Italian points to new low records. Demand Sterling fell to 4.64, a drop of five points from the low of last week. Paris checks were quoted at 6.00, a loss of ten cents, and lire at 647 registered a break of eight cents from last week's. These rates rebounded sharply in the final hour, on announcement that our bankers were holding a conference to bring about remedial measures.

Other news bearing upon the financial situation dealt with another advance in prices of manufactured steel and iron, and crop advices from the west and southwest confirming last week's favorable reports. London sold moderately in this market of the international list, all these issues showing distinct heaviness abroad.

Bonds were irregular, with heavy trading in New York Central debentures. Total sales, par value, \$5,000,000.

## CLOSING LETTER OF N.Y. MARKET BY E. & C. RANDOLPH

(McDougall & Cowans.)

New York, Aug. 16.—There was a period of comparative dullness in the market after midday when prices eased off a little from their best figures, but the hesitation did not continue long and there was a brisk rally with a resumption of great activity in the last half hour. This recovery was due to the belief that arrangements have been practically perfected for the floating of a British loan or the establishment of a large credit in New York and that an announcement of one would be made in the very near future. The matter is of the greatest interest and should the present difficulty in exchange be satisfactorily overcome, the effect on the market for the railroads would be beneficial. Demoralization in the exchange market if allowed to continue would not only involve renewed liquidation of American securities for foreign account but would inevitably lessen the demand for American products and keep the buying down in the world over. The immense losses, therefore, due to the decline in foreign exchange rates will be borne, by the foreign buyers.

The maximum depreciation today in pounds sterling was four and three-quarters per cent. below normal.

## COMPLETE DEMORILIZATION OF FOREIGN EXCHANGE MARKET

Sterling Francs, lire and virtually all Foreign Exchange carried down to new depths by torrent of bills which poured into market to pay for big war contracts.

New York, Aug. 16.—The American dollar ruled the financial world today with an iron grip. Pounds sterling, francs, lire, virtually all foreign exchange, went down to new depths in a torrent of bills that poured into the exchange markets from American manufacturers seeking pay for the big war contracts of munitions and other supplies purchased here by the warring nations of Europe.

Coincidence with the startling decline in exchange rates, came the assertion from an unimpeachable source that every contract made by the American manufacturers for supplies sent abroad called for payment in American dollars and not English pounds sterling which have heretofore been the standard of finance the world over. The immense losses, therefore, due to the decline in foreign exchange rates will be borne, by the foreign buyers.

The maximum depreciation today in pounds sterling was four and three-quarters per cent. below normal.
