They saw the functions of government "carried on by a usurper, who exercises his authority, not in virtue of any power derived from the people, but solely as the outcome of arbitrary enactments and political might. They see this usurpation of the authority of government maintained through a combination of political autocracy and industrial plutocracy brought into being by war conditions and fostered through war necessities."

Canada, he said, was becoming more and more impatient of this reactionary spirit and the perpetuation of the militaries spirit by which it seeks to support itself, and he pointed to the results of the ejections in yarmaska and Medicine Hat as the decisive volce of the elections of Canada.
