FIGURES THAT TELL STORIES FOREST WEALTH-USE AND DESTRUCTION

CENATOR EDWARDS, president of the Canadian Forestry Association, is on record as saying that if there had been no destruction of the forest, except by the lumberman's axe, East-ern Canada would be practically unbroken timber tract today. This is another way of saying that our forest wealth is not put through the mill and used,

but is, for the most part, destroyed by fire. This

destruction still goes on, but not with such deplorable rapidity as in former years. The waste which has taken place up to the present is illustrated in the pictures-seven times as much destroyed by fire as cut for the use of man. It is but poor consolation to kno wthat the United States authority who prepared the figures on which these are based estimates that with a smaller area and a considerably greater cut, the United States has burned as much per square mile as Canada. Contrasted with this is the fact that, in such countries as France, Germany,


ANOTHER GAS STRIKE IN ALBERT FIELDS




