Senior Ensign Glengarry Light Infantry, 6th Feb., 1812; appointed Lieutenant and Paymaster in 1813. Was present at the actions of York, Sackett's Harbor, Cross Roads, Fort George, Lundy's Lane, and Fort Erie. Wounded at Sackett's Harbor. Was recommended for a Seat in the Legislative Council, Can., in 1844, and appointed by Her Majesty in 1847, a Life Member of that body, where he sat until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867.—Perth, Ont.

MILLER, Hon. William. L.

Descended from a family that emigrated to N. S. over eighty years ago. B. at Antigonish, N. S., 12th February, 1835. Ed. at the Grammar School, St. Andrews, and at the Antigonish Academy. Is unmarried. Admitted as an Attorney and Barrister of the Supreme Court, N. S., 1860. Sat in Leg. Assembly, N. S., from g. e., 1863, until the Union, and while in that House rendered material assistance to the Union cause. It was owing to the suggestion of Mr. M. that the Govt. delegation to England was appointed to confer with the Imperial authorities for certain modifications in the Quebec scheme of Union which would make the Confederation of B. N. A. acceptable to the people of N.S. Was nominated as a delegate to the London Conference of 1866-7, but declined the appointment. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May. 1867.-Halifax, N.
