DURATION OF THE SESSIONS, &c.

HE Parliament of the Dominion of Canada let for the first time at Ottawa, on the 6th lov., 1867. On that day the Hon. J. E. Cauchon who was on the 5th Nov. appointed Speaker the Senate) took and subscribed the oath rescribed by law, and was then conducted to be Chair at the foot of the Throne, where he beeved the Governor-General; on the 7th, His scellency delivered the Speech from the hrone; on the 11th, the Hon. G. W. Allan loved, seconded by the Hon. J. McCully, the fund address in reply to the Viceregal speech, hich was agreed to on the same day. On the 1st Dec., the Senate adjourned until the 12th larch, 1868, when it re-assembled and continued sit until the prorogation on the 22nd May.
