Its rapid technological development has permitted this, while making available to the industry increasing supplies of raw material in the form of what was formerly waste. These gains in productivity have been largely due to improvements in manufacturing techniques with little cor-

responding advance in the growing or production of wood. The industry, now using over 30 million tons of wood a year is largely dependent on the United States market.
