Alberta lowers loan requirements

CALGARY (CUP) ---- Summer savings requirements for getting student aid in Alberta will not be ridgidly enforced this year.

According to the University of Calgary Loan Officer Vivyan O'Niel, the changes in the rules governing the scheme are due to the high rate of student unemployment over the summer months.

In past years students were expected to have a minimum saving of \$600 before a loan could be assured.

"This policy still holds," O'Niel said, "but because of the unusually low employment this summer, the policy will be waived a bit and or has the capabilities of being a different sort of experience as far as residence living goes.
