Former trustee hired

Former ward 4 Peel Board of Education trustee Doug Paton has been hired as the board's director of administrative services.

Mr. Paton served on the board from 1972 to 1978 when he decided not to seek re-election. He is manager of industrial sales and contracts for Hawker Siddeley Canada in Malton. The 50-year-old Mississauga resident is a member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

As director of administrative services, Mr. Paton will be responsible for supervising computer services, regional and area business offices and printing. The appointment is effective Dec. 1.

Schools raise \$62,000

The 57 Peel schools which participated in the Marathon of Hope raised a total of \$62,574 on behalf of Terry Fox for the Canadian Cancer Society.

A report to be submitted to the Peel Board of Education tonight shows seven Mississauga schools collected over \$1,000. Among the secondary schools Erindale donated \$3,300, Cawthra Park \$3,091, Applewood \$2,548, Lorne Park \$1,645, Morning Star \$1,408, W.J. Wood \$1,216 and Brandon Gate Public School \$1,189.

Transfer policy ready

A special committee of teacher federation and Peel Board of Education administrative officials have agreed on a transfer and surplus policy for secondary school teachers.

A joint report will be presented to teachers and to the Peel board for ratification.

Details of the agreement will not be released until it has been adopted by the two sides. Dan McDevitt, chief negotiator for District 10 of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation, says there are "important differences" between the agreement for secondary teachers and a transfer and surplus clause developed last year as part of Peel elementary teachers' agreement.

Details of the proposal are to be presented to representatives from each secondary school and to the teachers' district council executive today.

The proposal deals with how the Peel board will determine which teachers are retained by the board in case declining enrolment results in dismissal of teachers.
