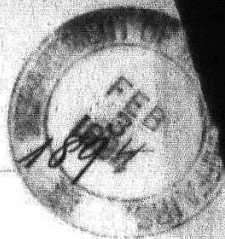

At the head of the Livingstone River in Queen's Co. a Section of Indian
Reserve of Four Hundred Acres was laid out a number of years ago.
Some time say 40 years the Indians have not used these lands.

About 20 years ago an English gentleman built a house & lived
there for 2 or 3 years on leaving he sold his house & improvement
to John D. McClean & one of Livingstone who applied & received a Confirmation
of 200 acres. The Hon. Joseph Howe was then Acting as Comr. of Indian
Affairs. Afterward a gentleman Mr. A. Forbes Freeman purchased
from McClean & one of the 200 acres and also purchased from the Indians
the remaining 200 acres. Mr. Freeman has asked me to ask
from your department if he will require any additional land
to the 200 acres he purchased from the Indians if so what
course he will have to pursue to get title confirmed and what
by the Govt. I might say that the lands had been stripped of a
timber before Mr. Freeman purchased from Indians it is
barren and of very little value.
