as I understand, this could not be done and Mr.

Dodemiede would be obliged to await his turn on the
list of applicants for entry. However, under a
recent law which went into effect on July first
British subjects are entitled to considerable more
admissions than formerly and it is possible, therefore, that the delay in securing Mr. Dodemiede's
admission may be considerably shortened. Mr. Heintzleman, however, will have all this information, and I
know he will be happy to communicate with you personally.
