Ottawa, November 10, 1913.

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th instant, with inclosed returns of timber sales and seasons of 1911-1912 and 1912-1913, and in reply to inform you that the specifications of logs over 18 feet in length should have been computed in cubic form instead of board measure.

The table used for this purpose is on page 65 of Scribner's Lumber & Log Book, American edition, headed "Cubical Contents of Round Timber."

The specifications will be returned to you with a table showing cubical contents of round timber, which I have to request you to use in making the required corrections.

As there is no means apparently of ascertaining the exact percentage of Jack Pine, the same percentage as was accepted by the Ontario Government will suffice as a basis for this Department.

The charge for annual ground rent is \$60.00 and for renewal fee for license, \$2.00.

The reserves under Treaty 3, including Abigoon, have not been confirmed as yet by the Ontario Government, although the administration under certain restrictions is exercised by this Department.

You may send Mr. Margach a copy of the specifications as requested.
