
Ottawa, July 26, 1915.

Sir,-

In reply to your letter of the 20th instant and previous correspondence, I beg to enclose copy of a letter which was addressed to the Superintendent of Game & Fisheries, Quebec, on the 15th of July; and also a copy of his reply dated the 20th instant.

You will see from Mr. Caron's reply that his Department has a verbal understanding with Mr. Derome, lessee of the fishing rights in the Bersimis river, that the Indians may fish for their subsistence. It would appear therefore that the lessee should have no objection to the Indians selling fish caught by them to enable them to obtain the necessaries of life.
