several blows and knocked me down in the gutter. I asked a British soldier who came along to go in for my coat. He went in and a fight started. While the fight was going on I slipped in and got my coat.

- Q.1. "Do you recognize the accused Pte. Guyette as one of the soldiers in the Cafe "?.
- A.1. "Yes sir".
- Q.2. "On your oath do you recognize Pte. Guyette as the man who hit you outside the Cafe"?.
- A.2. "Yes sir".

The witness is cross-examined by the accused:

- Q.1. "Was the soldier you sent into the Cafe carrying any
- A.1. "The soldier was carrying a Sten gun".

SIXTH WITNESS FOR PROSECUTION: B-9589 Pte. Parker, R.M., 64 Cdn Army Tpt Coy R.C.A.S.C., having been duly sworn states:

I was drinking a bit on 24 NOV 44. I met up with Ptes. Guyette, Livingston, O'Brien and Murdoch. They left me and went to another Pub. I heard they were in a fight and I went to get my pay Guyette out of the fight. When I asked him to come out he hit me. After the fight was over, he apologized and I took him back to "A" Pl Orderly Room.

The accused declines to cross-examine the witness.

The accused, C-36605 Pte. Guyette, S., having been warned and duly sworn elects to give evidence on oath, states:

O'Brien, Livingston and myself were drinking together on the 24 Nov 44. We were drinking Cognac and got pretty drunk. We went up town and went into the Mermans Cafe and found the English soldiers there. I decided to put them out amd went over and told them so. I followed Pte. War outside and there we had a fight. I turned around and went back in the Cafe and Pte. Hunt followed me in. One of the boys told him Sten gun off his shoulder. That was when the fight started with him. I don't know who struck the first blow. He was knocked down and then we left. I do not remember meeting up with CSM Watson that evening.
