

Toquart Indian Reserve,

August 2nd 1950, 19

We, the undersigned, Chief and Councillors of the Toquart Band of Indians owning the Reserve situated at Ucluelet, in the West Coast Indian Agency, in the Province of British Columbia at a council summoned for the purpose, according to the rules of the Band, and held on the said Reserve, this Second day of August, A.D. 1950, in the presence of the Indian Agent for the said Reserve, representing thereat the Minister of Mines and Resources for the Dominion of Canada;

Do hereby for ourselves, and on behalf of the Indian owners of the said Reserve, request that ~~as soon as possible~~

~~Dollars, be paid out of money standing in the credit of this Band for the purpose of~~

We be allowed to log off our Reserve No. 4 Chenatha situated at the mouth of the Chenatha river on Barkley Sound. The amount of \$4.00 (four dollars) to be credited to our Band Fund for every 1000 feet board measure removed. Said timber to be disposed of to the best advantage of the Band
