6. Mr. Pearson suggested that if any statement were to be made on immediate Canadian action resulting from the international situation, it should emphasize that Korea was but one sector in a much larger struggle and that any steps taken to accelerate Canada's defence programme made a contribution to the solution of the general problem. It was also suggested that it might be desirable to indicate that the Government would give sympathetic consideration to a Canadian volunteer contingent participating in any international force under the United Nations, if such were formed. This sort of participation appeared to be preferable to a contribution to a Commonwealth force and it might be helpful if we indicated support of it now so as to avoid any pressure that would probably come later for involvement in a Commonwealth force.

7. Mr. St-Laurent said that if Canada were to contribute to an international force it would probably be necessary to call Parliament.

8. The Minister of Finance suggested that there were dangers to seating Communist China in the Security Council in return for the Russians
