In addition, there was the visit in 1964 of Chancellor Erhard and in 1967 of President Lübke. Visits to the Federal Republic by Canadian ministers and Parliamentarians have also been frequent. The Secretary of State for External Affairs, Mr. Paul Martin, Trade and Commerce Minister Winters and Agricultural Minister Greene were in Bonn in 1967. Visitors in 1968 included Defence Minister Cadieux and Finance Minister Benson and a number of Parliamentarians.

The growing number of parliamentary visits taking place is a further indication of the strong ties linking the two countries.
