

3. To form a Museum of Antiquities, especially of the remains of Indian life in British Columbia and North America;

4. To form and preserve a Collection of Specimens of Ores and Natural History products, with special reference to British Columbia and Canada generally;

5. To establish a Library of books, pamphlets and periodicals bearing on the subjects of Art, Mineralogy, Botany, Geology, Zoology and other Sciences, and on the early history of British Columbia, and generally to cultivate the study of these subjects.

ARTICLE III.

Other Learned Societies having like objects may affiliate with this Association under an agreement to be approved by the Directors.

ARTICLE IV.

MEMBERSHIP.

1. All persons interested in the objects of this Association shall be eligible for membership and shall become members upon being duly elected and paying such annual fee as may be fixed by the Directors.
