

Extract from the Charter granted by the Province of Ontario in 1897, incorporating The Toronto Guild of Civic Art—a body corporate and politic for the purposes and objects following, that is to say:—

As a purely supervising, consulting and advisory body to promote and encourage civic art, including mural paintings and decorative sculptures, fountains and other structures or works of art or of an artistic character, and to arrange for the execution of works of art by competent artists to be chosen by competition or otherwise, and to hold exhibitions from time to time of works of art, . . . and for the said purpose to appoint an Advisory Board to carry out the objects of the Guild with powers to be declared by By-Law, provided that in all matters the services of the Advisory Board shall be without remuneration, under the name of "The Toronto Guild of Civic Art."
